What is happening to your church

1. The organ is being tuned this coming Thursday. It takes roughly a whole day of an organ tuner's time and requires two people. Michael Farley, the tuner and an organ builder, has a long association with our instrument. The value of a welltuned and well-maintained organ is far greater than the invoice. Besides which, the church is unlikely ever to see a replacement instrument of the quality we possess at the moment!

2. Two churchyard trees will receive surgery this Friday. It's all part of the trees growing older and for safety reasons, having dead branches removed. It will cost the church finances hundreds of pounds, but that is better than costing the neighbour's garden yet more damage or some passing person serious injury.

3. In January preservation experts will be visiting us and by studying the fabric and abseiling onto the roof, they will assess our several problems of water ingress. Unsurprisingly, they are historic building specialists and they will charge us for their expertise. But then, we cannot allow yet another fungus growth to appear in the Administrator's Office, the third this year or further water damage to our Lady Chapel ceiling.

All of which says that for our church services, church fabric and churchyard to have a future for ourselves and our descendants, we, on your behalf, are obliged to regularly invest significant amounts of money in maintaining St John's as a centre for prayer and worship in a wonderful and historic setting.
