Did you know? Part 2

Some scholars maintain that John the Baptist belonged to the Essenes, a semi-ascetic Jewish sect who expected a messiah and practised ritual baptism. Most biblical scholars agree that John baptized Jesus, and several New Testament accounts report that some of Jesus's early followers had previously been followers of John. According to the New Testament, John was sentenced to death and subsequently beheaded by Herod Antipas around AD 30 after John rebuked him for divorcing his wife Phasaelis and then unlawfully marrying Herodias, the wife of his brother Herod Philip I. Josephus also mentions John in the *Antiquities of the Jews* and states that he was executed by order of Herod Antipas in the fortress at Machaerus.

Followers of John existed well into the 2nd century AD, and some proclaimed him to be the Messiah awaited by Jews. In the Roman martyrology, apart from Jesus and the Virgin Mary, John is the only saint whose birth and death are both commemorated.
