Parking: A plea!

The grass verges just outside the church can become worn and bare when the wheels of cars are allowed to be parked on the grass, especially in autumn and winter conditions. To preserve the looks of our churchyard we are asking everyone to consider where and how they park, not just on Sundays but at other times too. We appreciate that St John's is very poorly-off for car parking: there is room for several cars at the front and there is the old Rectory car park on the 'wrong side' of a main road. Priority in front of the church needs to be given to any Blue Badge holders or someone with an official Permit. On Tuesday and Thursday Sharon Chorley, our Administrator, is given a space for her car near the drive entrance. It is true that parked cars at the front are often visitors, and we must find an answer to their needs. However, we do need to give absolute priority and unhindered access to emergency vehicles, such as an ambulance or first responder, when the church and hall are being used. We shall start using the No-parking cones to protect the grass verges. We have a heavy metal sign on a stand about parking which should be placed somewhere near the entrance to the drive. For those of us who are sufficiently mobile, there is free car parking in Longforth Road (ASDA) on Sundays and at other times after 6.00 p.m.

Bishop Michael's Visit

It will also be an ideal opportunity for any of you to discuss what matters to you and your church and, I am sure, "get some answers!"
